10:00-10:30 Calliope Correia – The Healing Power of Plants

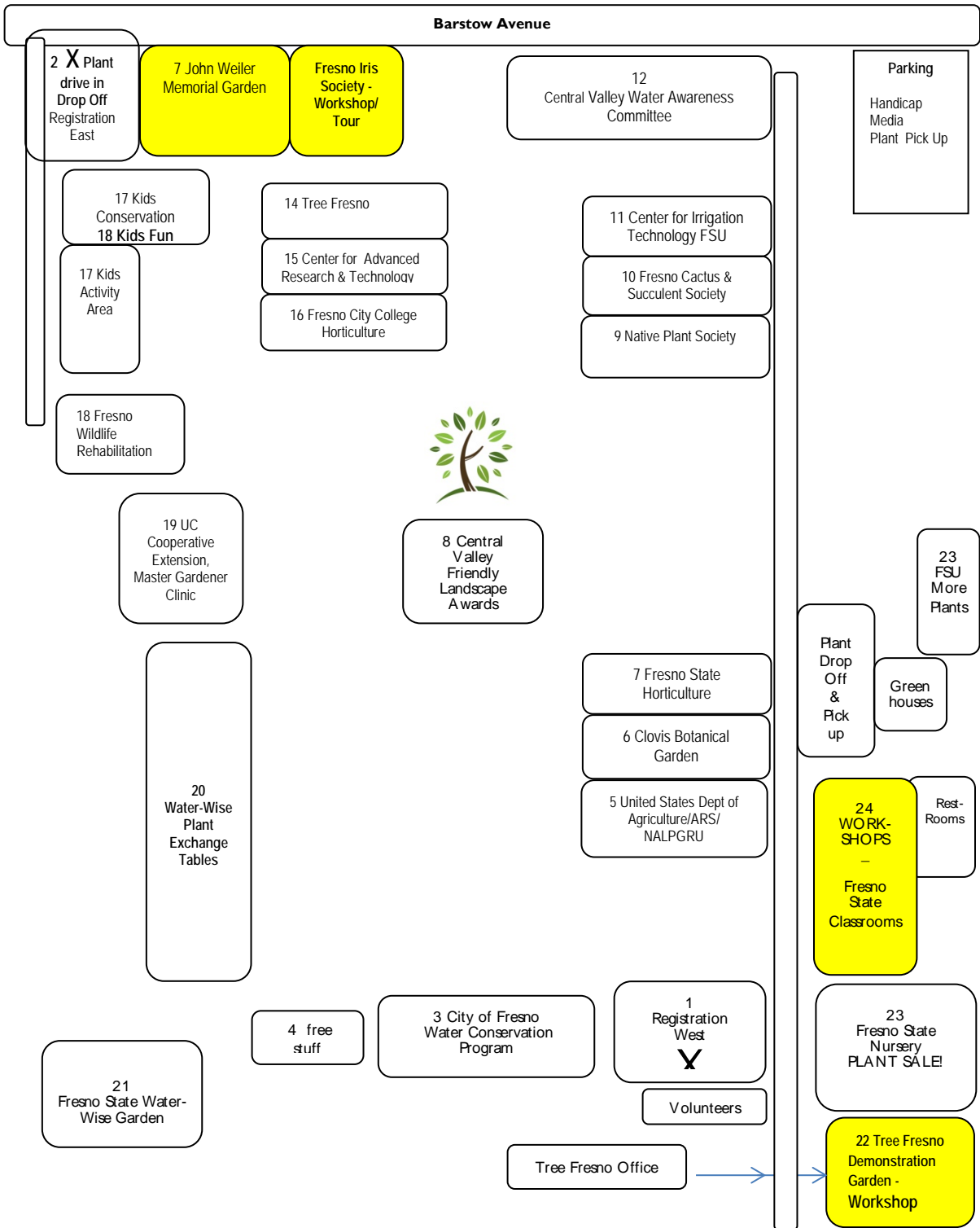
OH Classroom
